OFFICER RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. Approves allocation the 2022/23 R oads to Recovery funding to the reconstruction of SLK 2.92 to 9.30 on Quairading Corrigin Road.
- 2. Approves moving the propose 2022/23 Roads to REcovert projects to the 2023/24 Capital Works Programme (Budget yet to be finalised)
- 3. Approves the other minor I&E code changes within the General Ledget as outlined in attachment 2.

IN BRIEF

The Capital Works programme has progressed to a point where final costings have become clearer.

There is likely a need to allocate some additional funds from other funded programmes across to the project to ensure all our financial commitment can be met.

Those projects initially allocated Roads to Recovery funds are proposed to be pushed back a few months and achieved during 2023/24 financial year.

MATTER FOR CONSIDERATION

The current expenditure for the Regional Roads Group project on the Quairading Corrigin Road are provided in Attachment 1. Please note there are two Regional Road Group project codes (for the two different years amounts) but these have been added together within the table as each section is roughly half of the project.

The Shire potentially has an overspend of approximately \$384,000 for this 6km of works. There are a few costs yet to be finalised which are highlighted in yellow. These have been conservatively estimated and shown as 'worst case scenario'.

The EMWS anticipated needing additional funds due to the higher than projected construction costs since initial budgets were planned and the fact of rising inflation and things have taken longer than

forecast with weather and supply issues and delays and additional carting expenses. This then flows into higher traffic control costs and increased water truck usage.

Allocating our 2022/23 Roads to Recovery funds will assist the Shire to fund an additional \$235,375 of works.

Despite all the setbacks, the EMWS anticipates that we will get both of these road projects completed successfully by early June.

There are some other minor adjustments to other expenditure under a General Ledger as provided at Attachment 2.

BACKGROUND

Council adopted their 2022/23 Budget Review at their meeting on Thursday 30th March 2023.

Since then, the Capital Works programme delivery has been progressed to the point where final costings have become clearer. The project is in need of some additional funds to complete the scope of works.

Council requires an Absolute Majority vote to reallocate funds once there is an approved Budget in place.

These adjustments provide no additional expenditure to the overarching General Ledger codes as per the adopted Budget (and any subsequent reviews) with the exception of the major roadworks programme as outlined above. The adjustments are mainly for the movement of funds between the various Income & Expense code allocations – such as between Employee Costs to Materials in the Caravan Park – to allow operational goals to be met.
